

Center for Students with Disabilities

Another great resource DePaul offers is the Center for Students with Disabilities (CSD) for students with a range of disabilities pursuant to the Americans with Disabilities Act and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act.

The goal of CSD is to provide equal access to DePaul's many opportunities. Full-time, part-time, undergraduate, and graduate students are encouraged to enroll with CSD using this form which will involve a personal meeting with CSD staff.

One service offered by the CSD is Career Opportunities for Students with Disabilities (COSD) which helps students and recent graduates to more finely tune their job searching tools. Another service is assistive technology offered by DePaul which includes alternate text format, text to speech, note taking, hearing supports, and visual supports. CSD also hosts a web-based community that is a space for job seekers with disabilities and employers to network.

Finally, DePaul awards many gift aid scholarships that do not have to be earned by working, including the Deloitte Scholarship for Students with Disabilities and the Chronic

Illness Scholarship.

The Center for Students with Disabilities has locations on both campuses. The Loop location is at the Lewis Center on 25 East Jackson Boulevard in Suite 1420. The Lincoln Park location is at the Student Center on 2250 North Sheffield Avenue in Room 370 and is open Monday - Friday 9am - 5pm. For more information, contact CSD at csd@depaul.edu.
