Welcome back! Please read on to learn about a new paid research opportunity from DePaul for both undergraduates and graduates. MUSE (Master's Undergraduate Scholarship Engagement), aims to support undergraduate students from underrepresented, diverse backgrounds. The pilot program seeks to enable CSH undergraduate students to learn about research through collaboration on a research project and mentorship from a graduate student. Selected graduate student mentors and undergraduate student mentees each receive \$750 to collaborate on a project beginning in Spring 2023 and ending in Spring 2024. On Tuesday, April 4th, from 3:30 - 4:30 pm in McGowan South 401, there will be a MUSE Networking Event where grad students who have submitted proposals for this program will share briefs for prospective pairings with interested undergrads. Application materials and links will be distributed to all students who attend this networking event. Students who have completed at least 16 quarter hours with a declared CSH major and GPA of 2.75 and above are eligible to apply.
