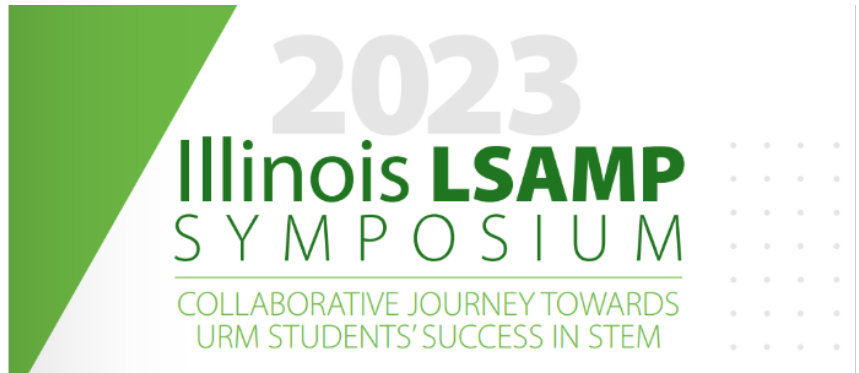

COURSE CATALOG OPENS MONDAY/REGISTRATION BEGINS FEBRUARY 2

As you prepare for Spring & Summer registration, please note the following:

- ENV 205 Biology for Environmental Studies is only offered once per year and is required for ENV BA majors.
- ENV 322 Ecosystem Ecology has odd times (MW 1–2:30 p.m. lecture & TH 11:20 a.m. – 12:50 p.m. lab) but is being offered for the first time in many years
- We will not be able to offer ENV 181 Landscape Architecture this year. If you are an Environmental Studies BA major, both ENV 160 and ENV 165 are being offered in the Humanities category.
- ENV 359 Advanced Ecological Data Analysis with R is being offered hybrid this spring quarter (Monday 11:20 a.m. – 12:50 p.m.) and prepares you for a paid summer internship! The class is open to Environmental Science BS majors that have completed ENV 260 as well as Environmental Studies BA students that have a background in R. This class will count towards a 300-level ENV class for both BA and BS majors, even if it is not listed on your DPR. John T. Richardson Library Offers Plethora of Resources for Students

DePaul University has an excellent four-story library with over one thousand study seats, three study lounges, a computer lounge, 14 group study rooms, three conference rooms, and many special collections. These resources, along with a plethora of journals, books, and other writings, are regularly available to DePaul students.

Named after DePaul's 9th President, the John T. Richardson Library on the Lincoln Park campus has a first floor collaborative level with a computer lab where many DePaul students spend their time. Every floor after the first floor gets quieter and quieter, up until the fourth floor where the level is considered quiet.

Each department has an assigned library liaison to help with library services and resource questions along with research project assistance. The library liaison for Environmental Science and Studies is Cristopher Parker who can be reached at atcparke17@depaul.edu. He is a science librarian who specializes in reference, instruction, and academic engagement. He and other librarians are very open to assisting you in research, even with developing a research question in this video.

The John T. Richardson Library is open Monday through Thursday 7:30 a.m. - 12:00 a.m. and Friday 7:30 a.m. to 9:00 p.m., On weekends, the Library hours are Saturday 10:00 a.m. - 9:00 p.m. and Sunday from 10:00 a.m - 12:00 a.m.

Place, Liberation, Advocacy, Community, Environment: (PLACE)-based Writing, Research, and Teaching in Transdisciplinary Rhetorical Studies



Kenneth Walker, PhD is an Associate Professor at the University of Texas, San Antonio. He is a rhetorical scholar-activist with expertise in interdisciplinary humanities at the intersections of ecology, technology, and community. Broadly, his research examines how ecological, cultural, and political rhetorics intersect through place-based, interdisciplinary, and community-engaged projects.



Carolina Hinojosa is a second-year doctoral student in English at the University of Texas, San Antonio. She conducts interdisciplinary research at the intersections of spatial rhetoric, digital humanities, and Latinx/Chicanx feminist ecologies. Hinojosa is native to San Antonio, Texas and engages in place-place community projects.

Telling stories across their community-engaged and transdisciplinary rhetorical work, Walker and Hinojosa will discuss PLACE-based research and teaching through the Urban Bird Project. From the neighborhoods of Chicago and San Antonio, they demonstrate how place-based pedagogies provide deep contexts for the work of liberation, advocacy, and community that must necessarily be done across disciplines, with kin, and through stories. Using scholarly and student examples of geolocating narratives across South Texas, borderlands story map projects, and restoring migratory birds through oral histories, Walker and Hinojosa will guide the audience in developing their own PLACE-based pedagogy across Chicago neighborhoods and beyond.

The Student Innovation Expo is your chance to test out those innovative ideas! This pitch competition celebrates students' creativity and challenges you to think outside the box.

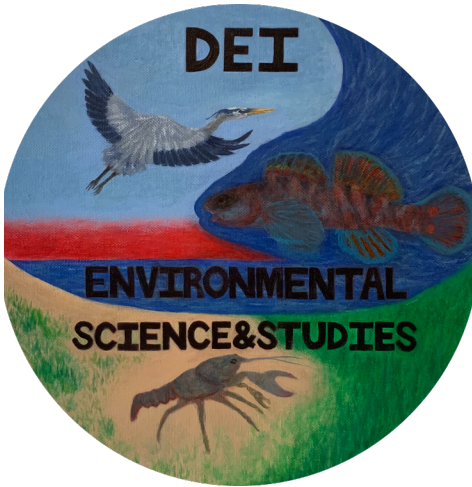
