stu 2.0 en GF	ny student who fails to maintain a 2.000 cumulative grade point average (C average) is on academic probation. A dent is removed from academic probation when the cumulative grade point average reaches the required minimum of 200. A student's status is reviewed after any Autumn, Winter, Spring, and Summer quarters in which the student was rolled in at least 1 credit hour. A probationary student may be limited to 12 credit hours per quarter until a cumulative 2A of 2.000 is reached. A student who remains on probation for three sequential quarters of enrollment may be missed."

>	Complete the Self-Assessment from your academic advisor
>	Try to earn a 2.5 or higher term GPA.
>	Repeat courses which you previously received a grade of D, F, or FX.
