2016-2017 School-Based Training Opportunities with Children and Adolescents at DePaul Family and Community Services

For the first time in the 2016-2017 academic year, DePaul Family and Community Services will offer a full clinical externship in school-based services with children and adolescents. This externship will include:

Chicago Public School Individual Therapy

Program: Chicago Public School contracts for therapeutic services to schools

Hours: 6 hours per week (3 billable)

Population: Predominantly low-income children and adolescents of diverse

ages with diverse presenting problems

Supervision: Weekly group and individual supervision

Cities Mentor and Mother Daughter Group Therapy and Consultation

Program: Social, emotional, behavioral, and academic treatment program Hours: 6 hours per week (3 billable; 2-6 p.m. on Wednesdays required)
Population: Low-income African American children and adolescents and their mentors (Cities Mentor Project) or mothers (Cities Mother Daughter Project)
Supervision: Weekly group and in vivo supervision
(6-hour positions solely with this team may also be available)

Chicago Public School Consultation

Program: Systems level consultation to high-stress Chicago Public Schools Hours: 6 hours per week (3 billable)

Population: Teachers and administrators at high-stress schools seeking to create effective systems for students with academic and behavior problems Supervision: Weekly in vivo supervision

Weekly Training Inservices

Hours: 2 hours per week (10 a.m. to noon on Wednesdays required)

If there are multiple qualified candidates for the position(s), priority will be given to applicants who: a) are able and willing to drive, b) are interested in completing more than one year of training at DePaul Family and Community Services, and c) have already completed at least one year of clinical practicum. Candidates from underrepresented groups are also encouraged to apply.

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
