

School-Based, Trauma-Focused Training Opportunities with Children & Adolescents at DePaul Family & Community Services 2019-2020

In the 2019-2020 academic year, DePaul Family and Community Services will offer a full clinical externship/internship in school-based services with children and adolescents exposed to chronic stress and/or trauma. This externship/internship will include:

Chicago Public School Individual and Family Therapy

Program: Individual and family therapy at Chicago Public Schools
Population: Predominantly low-income children and adolescents exposed to chronic stress and/or trauma (of diverse ages and presenting problems)
Supervision: Weekly group and individual supervision

Cities Mentor Project Group Therapy and Consultation*

Program: Group therapy (and consultation) using a dyadic and junior version of Structured Psychotherapy for Adolescents Responding to Chronic Stress (SPARCS)
Population: 6th-8th graders exposed to chronic stress and/or trauma and their undergraduate mentors
Supervision: Weekly group and in vivo supervision

*6-hour positions solely with this team may also be available

If there are multiple qualified candidates for the position(s), priority will be given to applicants who: a) are able and willing to drive, b) are interested in completing more than one year of training at DePaul Family and Community Services, and c) have already completed at least one year of clinical practicum. Candidates from underrepresented groups are encouraged to apply.
