## Non DePaul Study Abroad Programs

There are many independent providers of study abroad programs. To help ENV students find programs of interest to them, we have articulated the following study abroad programs and courses into the major. Note that non DePaul study abroad programs should be planned for prior to senior year to avoid petitioning for a senior residency exemption.
