FAQs for NSG 377 Clinical Experience

Q: When should I get started?

A: Today! The earlier you start looking for a site/mentor, the earlier you will find one leading to a less stressful experience for you.

Q: How do I even get started looking for a clinical site/mentor?

A: Start with where you work. You may complete your hours at the health care organization where you work, so long as you complete the hours in a separate department. See below for some ideas.

Q: What is the focus of this clinical experience?

A: The focus of the clinical must be community health, but that includes a wide range of health care. For example, you might find a mentor in:

- Employee Health Department
- Any outpatient health services
- Prenatal classes
- Diabetes education
- Smoking cessation
- Substance abuse prevention
- Weight management
- Cancer care

Q: Is there anyone that can help me with finding a clinical site/mentor?

A: Your supervisor is likely to have a whole range of nursing contacts, both within your organization and in nearby facilities, and might be able to suggest a good experience. Or, if you have already identified a department within your organization, your supervisor might be able to help you get your foot in the door. You should also consider asking your work colleagues and friends. Network, network!

Q: Are there any qualifications for my mentor?

A: Yes!

- Your mentor must have a BSN or higher.
- Your mentor must have unencumbered, active licensure.
- The focus of the clinical must be Community Health.

Q: What does the 80 hours of clinical entail?

A: The 80 hours of clinical hours can be library research hours, online research hours, or project planning for your clinical site. It does not have to be all hands-on clinical practice. It could also include meeting with experts and/or community leaders. It could include time and a variety of activities that are not generally as heavy-duty as hospital nursing.

Q: I found a mentor/clinical site. Now what?

A: Before you can attend your clinical, you must submit a formal request and CV of your mentor to the School of Nursing for approval. <u>Click here for more information</u>. All students must also <u>complete a set of health requirements</u>.

Q: When do I start these clinical hours?

A: You will complete these 80 clinical hours in NSG 377, which is the third quarter of your program.
