Pre-Licensure Students: The 77% Rule

The SON Faculty has voted that a minimum average of 77% must be earned on Proctored Exams to pass all Nursing Courses as applicable.

Students who have below the 77% average on Exams will be awarded a final course grade based solely on the Exam Average for that course.

Clinical Affiliation Agreements for Summer Quarter are to be submitted during the Winter Quarter. Please submit them as soon as you are able to.

This is a reminder that your clinical affiliation agreements are to be submitted THREE to SIX months in advance. If you do not submit them within that window, we cannot guarantee you receive the site you are requesting.

Please note that Spring Quarter affiliations should have already been submitted as the deadline was in December.

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Study Abroad: Czech Republic

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Adventures Overseas

Participants of the Nursing Study Abroad Program spend two weeks in Prague, Czech Republic. The experience brings new perspectives on the Healthcare Delivery Systems that would benefit our U.S. System.

15 students went with us from both Lincoln Park Campus and Rosalind Franklin University Campus.

Students enroll in pre- and post-trip versions of NSG 445, Professionalism, Advocacy, and Leadership, and NSG 540, Culture, Ethics, and Policy Analysis, that integrate academic learning with hands-on travel experience. Students will be completing two weeks of Clinical with cultural and current Global Contacts including Ukrainian refugee families through the RedCross.

While traveling, students have the opportunity to visit and talk with English-speaking nurses, doctors, and administrators who train and administer care within a nationalized health care system.Participants visit a variety health care facilities and cultural landmarks in Prague, Strakonice, Cesky Krumlov, and Ceske Budejovice in the Czech Republic. Accommodations are made in comfortable hotels in Prague, Strakonice, and Ceske Budejovice. Students are welcome to venture through the rest of the EU before and/or after the trip.

There is No Covid -19 Crisis at this time in the Czech Republic but we will proceed with caution.


