## **STUDENT NURSE POLITICAL ACTION DAY ON FEBRUARY 8TH**





Our new Balanced Stride - Master's of Entry into Nursing Practice (MENP) program has launched!

What's the difference between the Balanced Stride track versus the standard MENP? Balanced Stride is suited for students who are seeking to go to school while also balancing their daily life (i.e. work, parenting, etc.) Balanced Stride encompasses the same courses as the standard MENP track; however, Balanced

## CZECH REPUBLIC: GRADUATE NURSING PROGRAM STUDY ABROAD

The Graduate Nursing Program examines health care in the Czech Republic from a political, social, economic and ethical lens. This experience abroad allowed students to draw parallels and contrasts to health care policies, practice and access in the United States. With rising global concerns regarding access and affordability of health care, the program helps DePaul students acquire knowledge of international responses to similar issues.

Throughout the program, students visited a variety of cultural landmarks in Prague, Strakonice, Ceske Krumlov, and Ceske Budejovice. These landmarks include castles, palaces, cathedrals, museums and historical sites.







## **STUDENTS AWARDED NAHN SCHOLARSHIPS**


#### **INNOVATION AMONG NURSES**

Molly Netter PhD, MSN, APRN-FNP, BSN, BSC had her abstract "The Embodiment of Innovation Among Nurses" accepted for presentation at the <u>June 2025</u> <u>International Council of Nurses Congress in Helsinki,</u> <u>Finland!</u> Dr. Netter states, "Prior to my involvement with Society of Nurse Scientists, Innovators and Leaders (SONSIEL) I had no idea that "nurse innovators" even existed. We conducted this research Last May, and I was impressed to interact with nurses from all over the globe, from the hub of global innovation- Silicon Valley to war torn Turkey. I am talking about life-changing ideas, by nurses. We should be proud of our profession."

### **ALUMNI ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

DePaul University 2018 Alum, Ash E. Walter (RN, MSN, CPEN), was the clinical scientist on the team to get a BRAF-Targeted Drug approved by the FDA.

The National Cancer Institute (NIH) published an article featuring Walter's accomplishment, stating that "On April 23, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) granted accelerated approval to Tovorafenib (Ojemda) for kids aged 6 months or older who have low-grade glioma, a

type of brain tumor, with changes in a gene called BRAF. The approval applies to tumors that can't be completely removed with surgery or have come back after surgery. To receive Tovorafenib, children must also have already received one prior <u>systemic treatment</u>, such as chemotherapy, after surgery."

This accomplishment could not be possible without the clinical scientists involved who facilitated rigorous studies to track the effects for years prior to it's approval.
