Students entering the program with prior graduate work are permitted to transfer a maximum of 8 credit hours (equivalent to two classes) towards the doctoral program if the following conditions are met. First, the credit must not have been applied towards the completion of a previous graduate degree. Second, the course materials must be reviewed and approved by the clinical faculty. Prior graduate work is not expected to decrease the time to completion.
